Source Selection	<p>You selected a variety of sources from databases, professional journals, and books that are written at appropriate level for this paper's purpose.</p> <p>The connection between your sources and your topic is clear.</p>	<p>Sources are 75% or more related to your topic. You selected a variety of sources and most are written at the appropriate level for this paper's purpose.</p> <p>In most cases the connection between your sources and the topic is clear.</p>	<p>Sources mostly cover your topic, but the relevance to your topic is less clear.</p> <p>The sources you selected are less varied, but most are written at the appropriate level.
